About the Carters



While Michael served as an intern in Chiba, Japan, God revealed to him the need for the gospel in this nation where many have never heard the message before. His heart for the Japanese led to a desire to do long-term ministry in Japan. In order to be better equipped, he returned to the U.S. where he earned his master's degrees in biblical studies and teaching English as a second language.

For two years Cathalain's family was stationed in Japan. She was exposed to the Japanese culture by living off base and attending a Japanese school. Although Cathalain was young, this experience shaped her love for other cultures. After graduating from Florida Southern College she taught high school in Virginia.

Michael and Cathalain met in Virginia and were married in May 2007. Together they share a heart for the Japanese and have been called to serve the Lord on the church-planting team in Nagoya, Japan. Currently they reside in Lakeland, FL where the couple is involved in Parker Street Ministries, a neighborhood revitalization project.



The Spiritual Need in Japan

- Less than 1% of Japanese profess Evangelical Christianity, categorizing them as an unreached people group
- There is one church for every 16,000 people in Japan; in Nagoya there is one church for every 26,000 people
- Cultural pressures led to over 33,000 suicides in 2007 and continue to increase depression rates

Current Ministries in Nagoya



- Two church plants with team involvement in five area churches (Four of the five churches are led by nationals)
 - Various evangelistic ministries including small group Bible studies, English classes, Mom and Kid's club, cooking classes and ministry to college students
 - Short-term mission trips
 - International Christian Academy of Nagoya (ICAN) – Currently there are 130 kids from preschool to 8th grade who are mostly Japanese. The school is expanding to offer 9th grade in 2009-2010.
- Seminary for training and equipping national leaders led by the Nagoya Theological Training Team

Partnering with the Carters

The Carters desire to join the Nagoya Church-Planting team in Summer 2010. Once in Nagoya, Michael will assist in church-planting through leading evangelistic English classes, leading Bible studies and supporting other church ministries. Michael and Cathalain will also be involved in ministering to the college students in Nagoya.

This includes salary, benefits, ministry expenses, home assignments, travel expenses and other various costs.
